Finally, to understand the temporal nature of flowsheet documentation over a 12-hour shift we randomly selected 3 use cases from each shift (day and night shift) and type of clinical unit (acute and critical care) in our data set, for a total of 12 use cases, and plotted them on a timeline with the timestamp for each data entry on the x-axis.
