Also called clubfoot, Madagascar palm grows with a swollen trunk lined in three-clustered spines and branches bearing a spiraling cluster of slender green leaves.

Only seedlings and young plants are showing white veined leaves. If placed warm the Madagascar Jewel can show its little white flowers throughout the year. Seeds are shooted into the air to spread them. At 20 °C (68) seeds need about 3 weeks to germinate.

Madagascar Jewel (Euphorbia leuconeura)

A storm in 1685 brought, in a wind-tossed brigantine seeking haven in the port of Charles Town, the scant bushel of seed from Madagascar which became the source of the famous Carolina Gold rice. The story of rice growing from this period until 1911, when a storm destroyed rice planting in South Carolina is told here by one-time Governor Heyward who was a rice planter himself.
